Punctuality



- School starts at **8:45am**. Students start their day with their form tutors.
- Being punctual is a crucial space to feel a sense of belonging to our tutor group/ school.
- Form time is a vital part of the day and a place where we check in with them, get ready for the day, hold careers and PSHE sessions and share reminders.

Your first school day

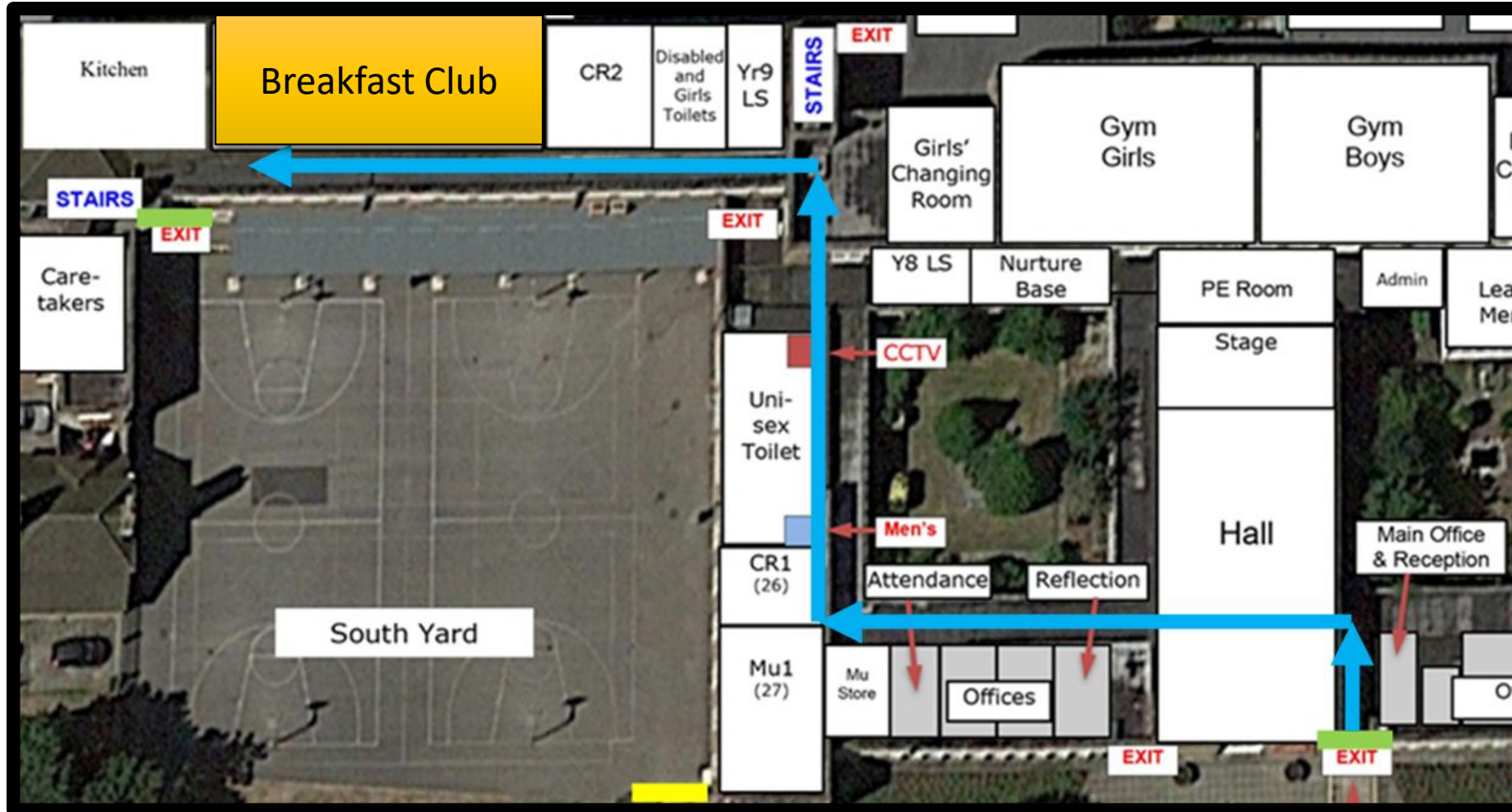


Thursday 3rd September

Entering school – 8am-8.20am



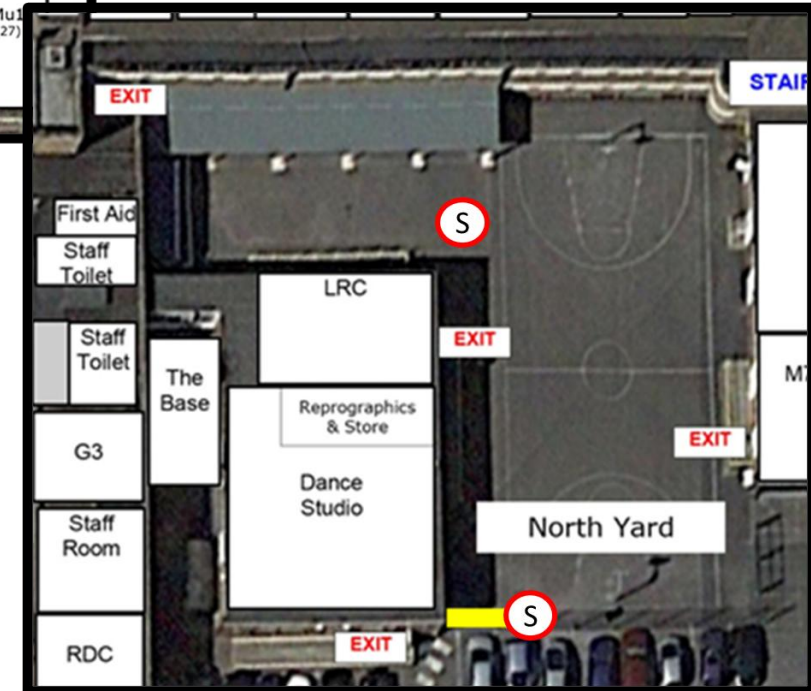
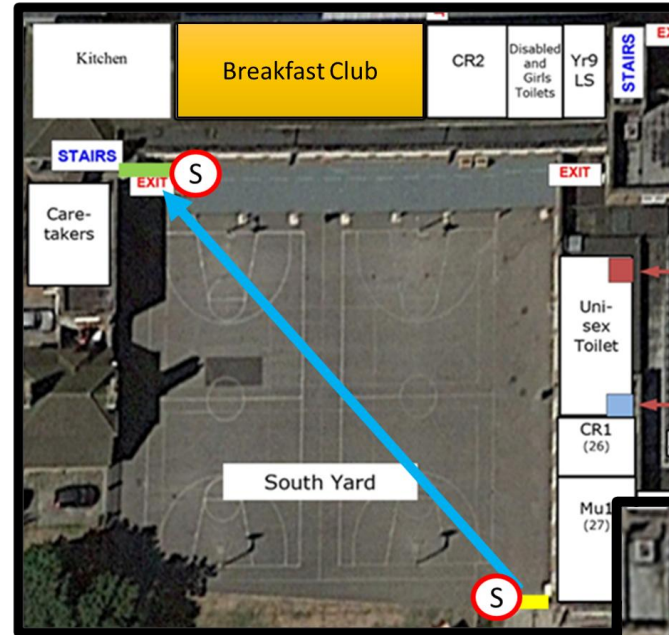
- Entrance via the **front office**.

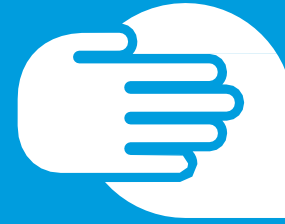

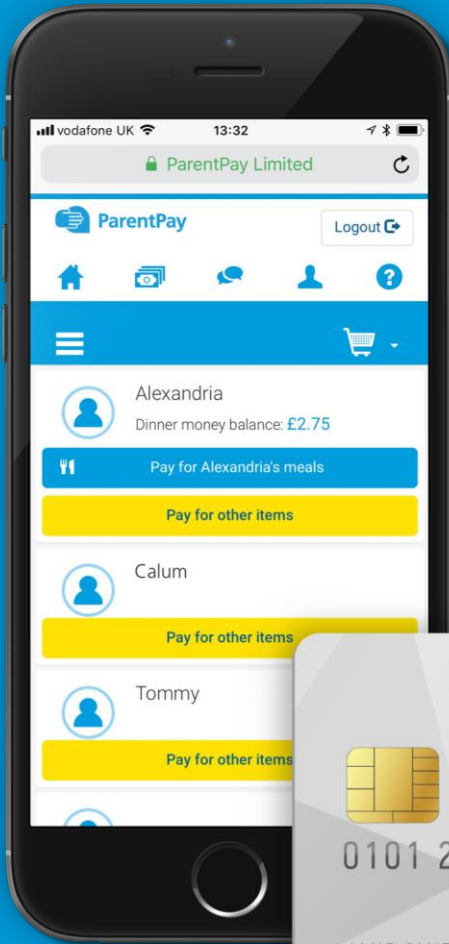

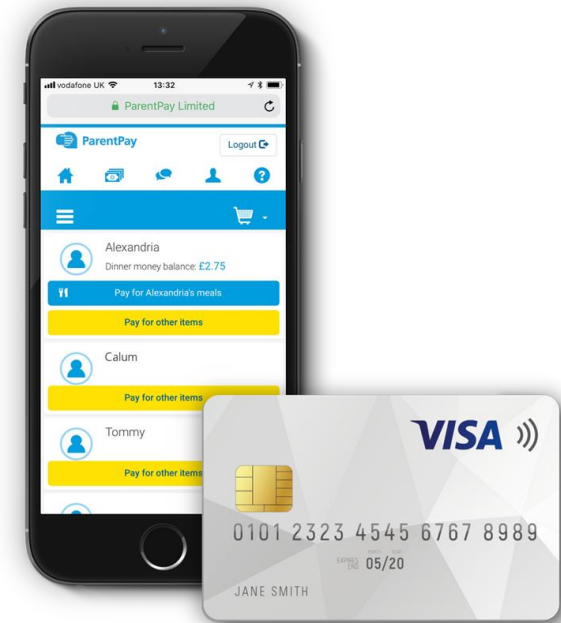
Parent Pay



We use ParentPay to allow parents and carers to securely add funds to their child's lunch account, which is then accessed through our cashless catering system in school.

At the point of sale, students are identified using facial recognition technology to provide a quick and efficient service; however, this is entirely optional.

If you do not consent, via the consent forms in the welcome booklet, to the use of facial recognition, your child will be issued with a unique 4-digit PIN to access their account and purchase meals instead

 - Don't forget to set up Alerts so you receive an email (free) or SMS text when your balance is low or there are new items to pay for

Please note: those on free school meals will get topped up each day automatically. This allocation is a set amount, so if it is used at break, students will not be allowed to purchase lunch.



WHAT HAPPENS IN SCHOOL

- Students will be given a letter to take home

Includes information about how to activate your account using a code

- Students facial recognition / biometrics will be completed in school

With parental permission by completing your welcome pack biometrics will take place in school when students start. **It is important that all packs are returned.**

- Students can access their account from day 3 in September

Students will need packed lunch until this time. Free school meals student will be able to access a lunch on all days.

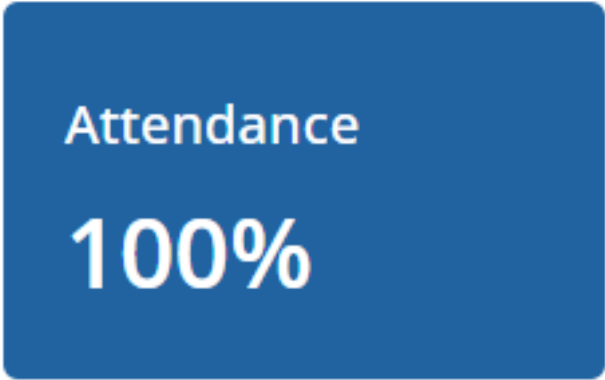

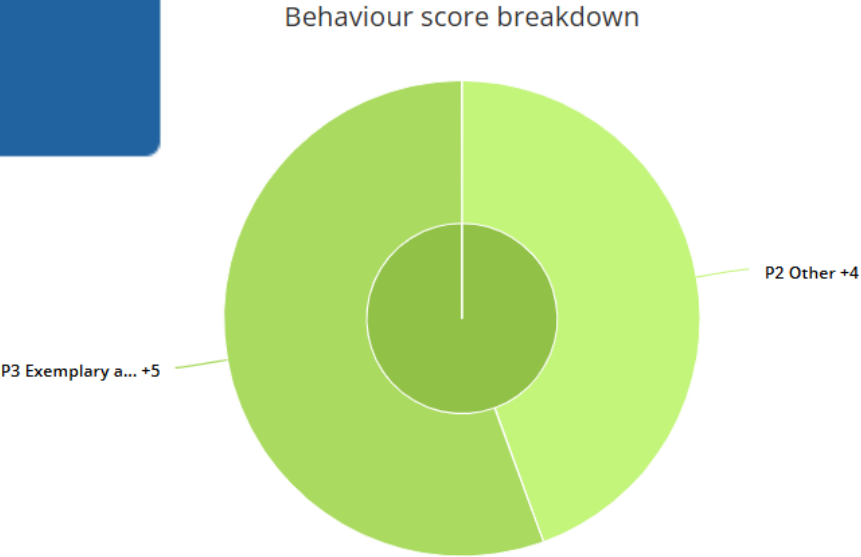
ClassCharts allows you to access timetables, track your attendance, behaviour and Homework.

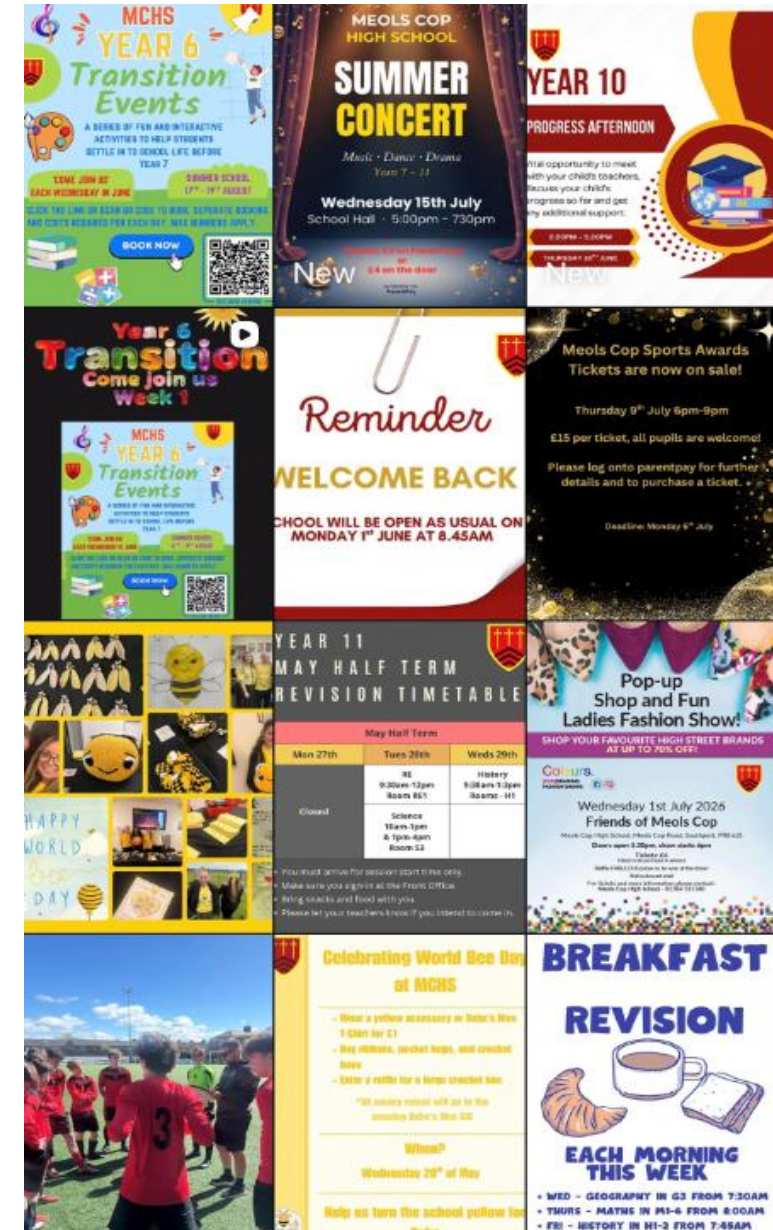
